

Soshiku launches, allowing students to never miss a due date again.

Seattle, WA -- September 25, 2008 -- Soshiku has launched today, allowing students to never miss a due date again. The website, located at Soshiku.com, is the first startup owned by Nonatomic, LLC.

Andrew Schaper, the 17-year-old founder, launched Soshiku after he himself could not find any reliable, easy way to keep track of his schoolwork. Aimed primarily at high school and college students, Soshiku has been made with ease of use and accessibility in mind.

After setting up an account, Soshiku users can add assignments directly from email, their mobile phone via text messaging (SMS), or the web interface. Users can also receive assignment due date notifications in advance to their email or mobile phone.

It doesn't stop there. As many high school and college students are aware, getting an assignment that requires partners is an inevitability. Users are able to add partners to their Soshiku account, so they can collaborate on notes, assign tasks to each other, and share important documents.

“Having a lot of classes, many high school and college students receive bad grades because of failure of finding a good system for them to manage their schoolwork efficiently, or from just not caring,” observed Andrew Schaper, Soshiku founder. “My mission is to make Soshiku the standard in schoolwork management, and to make it not be a chore.”

Created solely by Schaper, Soshiku is his first startup. He finds working on and administering websites enjoyable, and hopes to launch more startups in the future. Andrew Schaper is currently attending high school, and after graduating, wants to attend the University of Washington and major in computer science.
